CS -- MORNING INTRO - CZECHOSLOVAK SITUATION

MUNICH, SEPT 10 (CNR)-A FURTHER NORMALIZATION OF CZECHOSLOVAK LIFE IS EXPECTED TODAY FOLLOWING THE GOVERNMENT'S APPROVAL OF A LAW AUTHORIZING THE PRESENT COMPOSITION OF POLITICAL PARTIES.

RADIO BRATISLAVA SAID MONDAY THAT BRATISLAVA AIRPORT WOULD RETURN TO NORMAL TODAY, AND THE AUSTRIAN AND SWISS AIRLINES ANNOUNCED THAT THEY WOULD RESUME THEIR SERVICE TO PRAGUE TODAY.

THE BIGGEST WEST GERMAN TRAVEL AGENCY, SCHARNOW-TOUROPA, SAID ITS FIRST GROUP OF "CURE" GUESTS SINCE THE INVASION WOULD TRAVEL TO WEST BOHEMIAN SPAS TODAY.

RADIO PRAGUE SAID THE LAW APPROVED MONDAY CONCERNED THE NATIONAL FRONT, CZECHOSLOVAKIA'S COMMUNIST-LED MASS ORGANISATION.

IT SAYS THE EXISTING COMPOSITION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA'S POLITICAL PARTIES AND SOCIAL ORGANISATIONS FULLY CORRESPONDS WITH THE POLITICAL INTERESTS OF THE COUNTRY'S SOCIALIST SOCIETY.

THE GOVERNMENT, MEETING UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF DEPUTY PREMIER LUBOMIR STROUGAL, ALSO APPOINTED FRANTISEK VASEK AND JAROSLAV RYBAR DEPUTY MINISTERS OF THE INTERIOR.

CETEK SAID SOVIET DEPUTY FOREIGN MINISTER VASILY KUZNETSOV WAS DUE TO RETURN TO PRAGUE MONDAY AFTERNOON AFTER TALKS WITH SLOVAK LEADERS IN BRATISLAVA. PRAGUE RADIO SAID HE AND SLOVAK PARTY LEADER GUSTAV HUSAK DISCUSSED THE CURRENT SITUATION IN SLOVAKIA. THE SOVIET VISITOR ALSO MET SLOVAK NATIONAL COUNCIL CHAIRMAN ONDREJ KLOKOC.

CZECHOSLOVAK NATIONAL ASSEMBLY CHAIRMAN JOSEF SMRKOVSKY MONDAY TOLD A WORKERS MEETING NEAR PRAGUE OF A 15-ARTICLE PROTOCOL WHICH CONTAINED AN ARTICLE SAYING CZECHOSLOVAKIA WOULD ADHERE TO THE POLICY EMBARKED ON IN JANUARY THIS YEAR.
